SNOW EMERGENCY



DECLARATIONS

It's that time of the year again when snow will start to fall and snow will be plowed from public streets! Please review the following information when a snow emergency is declared.

Vehicles left on Mountain Lake city public roadways, streets and alleys, following a **Declaration of a Snow Emergency** will be ticketed and could be towed.

Snow emergencies generally will be declared before 9 p.m. and will take effect at midnight.

Vehicles left on public roadways, streets and alleys will be ticketed and possibly towed beginning at midnight.

Snow removal will begin after 3 a.m.

When a snow emergency is declared vehicles must remain off a public roadway, street, or alley until it is plowed curb to curb.

A Message from Mountain Lake Utilities

If you pay your utilities by mail please read the following information from a press release issued by the United States Postal System:

Starting on October 1, the postal service's current three –day delivery standard for First-class mail—letters, bills, tax documents and the like—will drop to delivery anywhere in the U.S. within five days. In other words, Americans should now expect letters and other mail could take up to five days to reach their destinations and vice versa.

You have some options regarding the payment of your utilities.

1. Automatic bill pay (ACH) allows us to withdraw funds from your checking account on the day the utility payment is due. You will still receive a utility bill in the mail so that you know the amount of the withdrawal from your account.
2. Use the utility drop box located on the east side of the city hall building.
3. You can make your payment on line with a debit or credit card. Just go to the city website (mountainlakemn.com) in the upper right hand corner you will find the icon (pay bill), click on the icon and you will go to the bill pay page. You will need your utility account number to complete the transaction. If you process the request yourself—we will refund your credit card fee.
4. Make your payment in person during regular business hours 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.
5. Mail your payment to the city the same day you receive your bill from the city.
