Mountain Lake Trail Public Hunting Awareness

- The trail passes through Minnesota Department of Natural Resources property on the west end of the lake.
- The area is roughly between the boat landing on the southwest corner of the lake and the Schmidt bench on the northwest corner of the lake.
- This portion of the trail is open to public hunting from September 1 through December 31.
- Trail users should be aware of hunters and are STRONGLY encouraged to wear blaze orange or other brightly colored clothing.
- Hunters should be aware of trail users.





Open Burning of Leaves

The open burning of leaves in the City of Mountain Lake is permitted between September 15 and December 1. The following rules apply:

- Only in residential areas.
- Only between the hours of 8 AM and 8 PM.
- Fires must be extinguished by 8 PM.
- Fires must be more than 25 feet from any structure, wood fence, hedge or bush.
- Fires must be more than 5 feet from any property line.
- The burning of leaves is prohibited on city streets, boulevards, lake shore, or any other public property by private citizens.
- Fires must be attended at all times.



City Burn Site

The burn-site is located at the corner of 360th Street and 575th Ave. From city limits, take 11th Street North northward and the street will turn to gravel which begins 575th Ave.
